



What is D-SNAP?

The Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) provides food assistance for individuals and families impacted by Hurricane Ian and who are not receiving food assistance benefits through the regular Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). In partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, D-SNAP is implemented by the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF).

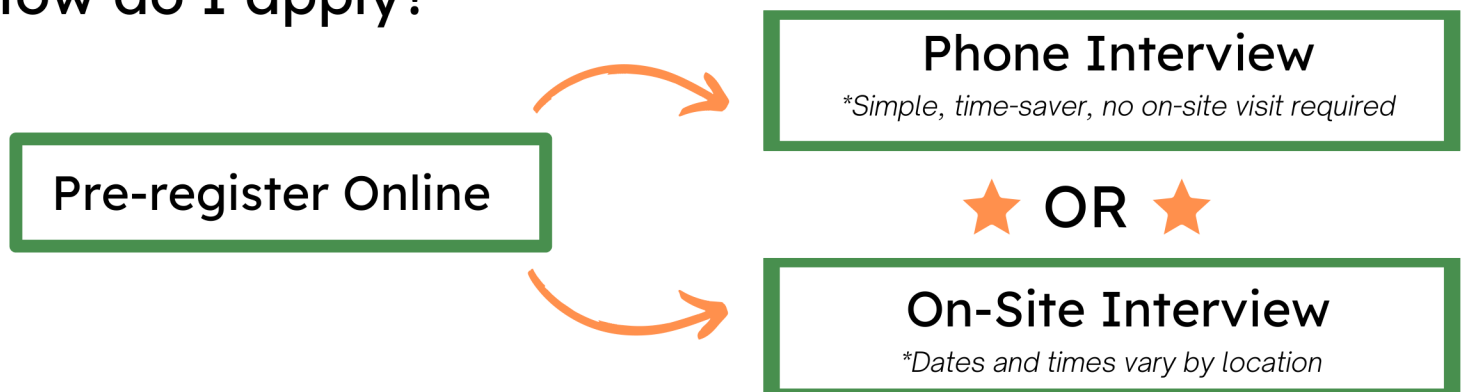
- D-SNAP will be implemented in phases by county.
- Pre-registration is required by all applicants.
- To expedite service to eligible households, DCF is offering phone interviews through the D-SNAP Call Center.
- DCF will also host in-person D-SNAP events for residents who cannot participate by phone.

Who is eligible?

To qualify for D-SNAP benefits:

- Applicants must NOT be receiving regular SNAP benefits
- Applicants must have been living or working in a disaster-declared county at the time of Hurricane Ian
- Applicants must have suffered a disaster-related loss such as:
 - Damage to their home(s) or self-employment property
 - Loss of food
 - Reduction or loss of income
 - Other disaster-related expenses
- Applicants must meet financial eligibility requirements
