AVOID CONTRACTOR HOME REPAIR FRAUD



VETTING A CONTRACTOR

Beware of potential **scams** if a contractor...



- Asks you to "take my word for it" and does not have a contract for you to sign
- Says he does not need a permit from a city or county that requires a permit
- Says he needs more money because of "unexpected" problems.
- Drives a vehicle with out-ofstate license plates.
- Works for a company that has an out-of-state address or only a P.O. Box or hotel address.
- Drives a vehicle that displays a different company name from the name of the company the contractor is supposed to work for.



CONSTRUCTION DO'S AND DON'TS:

- DO ask to see contractor's license and make sure it matches the person showing it
- DO contact the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation at 850-487-1395 or www.myfloridalicense.com to verify the status of the license
- **DO** determine how long the contractor has been in business
- **DO** ask for references & check them
- DO choose several contractors and get estimates from each AND make sure an estimate or bid includes:
 - Contractor's information
 - Detailed description of the work that will be done,
 - Separate costs for labor & material
 - Itemized costs for specific materials the contractor intends to use
 - o A timeline for the work
- DO get the agreement in writing –
 read the contract, fill in all the blank
 spaces, make sure it contains the
 contractor's name, address,
 telephone number, license number,
 description of the work, completion
 date and any warranty agreements.
- DON'T hire a contractor who requires advance payment – arrange to pay upon completion or in installments
- DON'T sign the work completion certificate until all the work is satisfactorily completed
- DON'T pay cash
- DON'T pull the construction permits

DO YOU THINK YOU ARE A VICTIM OF CONTRACTOR FRAUD?

If you or someone you know have been a victim of contractor fraud, contact the Florida Department of Financial Services' Division of Investigative and Forensic Services to report the incident. Contractor fraud is illegal and can lead to an arrest and prosecution.

You may also file a complaint with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, which acts as the State's consumer complaint clearing house.
